

## Instructions

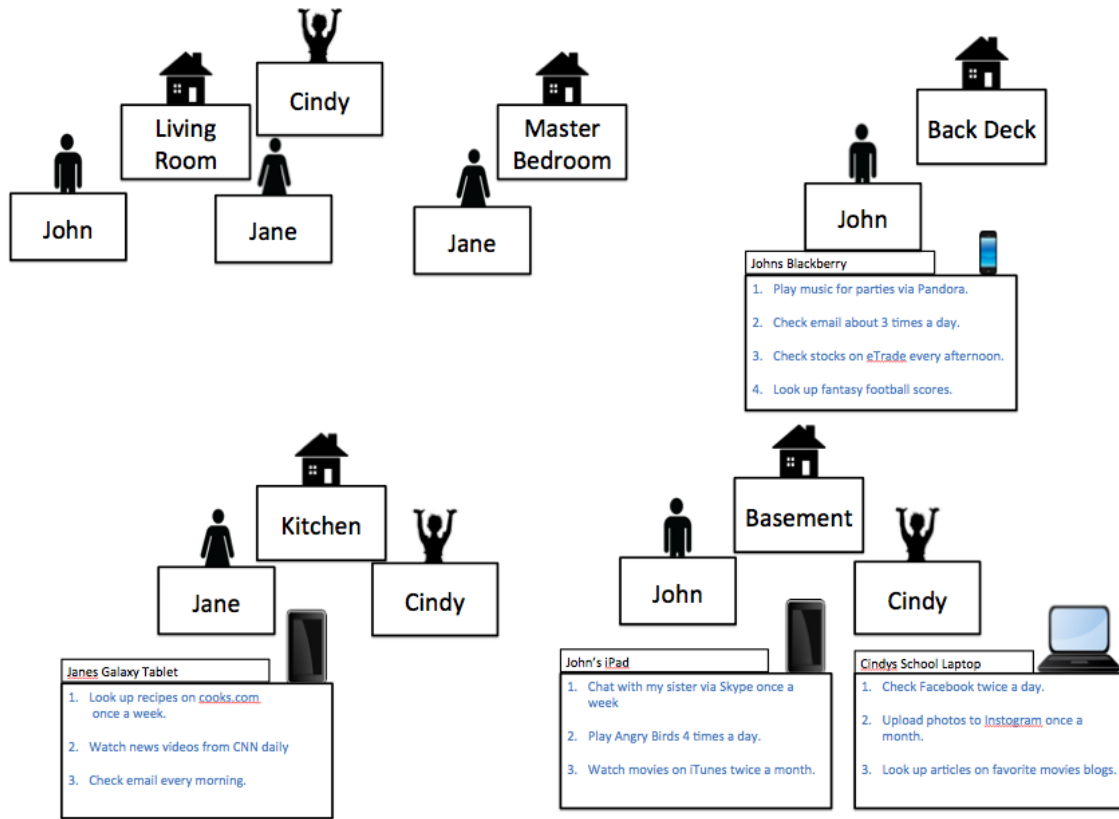
Thanks for signing up to help us with the Google Fiber user study. Part of this study is learning how you use the internet at home. To do that, you are going to visually create a diagram that shows how your household uses the internet. Follow the instructions below on how to do this.

1. Open the powerpoint document from the email entitled: “fiber origami”
2. Use the houses to indicate the locations in the home that you use the internet. Reposition the houses so that they are spread out over the screen. Then, label each one the location of the house that you use the internet (e.g. Living Room)
3. Use the people to indicate the household members that use the internet. Then reposition them next to each location in the house that they use the Internet. For instance, if John uses the Internet in both the Living Room and Kitchen, then make two for John and place one near the Living Room and one near the Kitchen.
4. Finally, use the different devices (laptop, tablet, etc.) to show what devices are used to access the internet. For each device provide the top activities that are done on each and how often. Also, use the top box to label what device it is. Finally, reposition the device next to the locations that it is used.

### Quick Tip

- Feel free to copy the slide in the Powerpoint document. Often times there is not enough space on one slide.
